

**COLLABORATIVE AGREEMENT  
BETWEEN  
EPINEPHRINE AUTO-INJECTOR (EAI) PROVIDER  
AND  
EMERGENCY HEALTH CARE PROVIDER  
FOR THE PROVISION OF  
EPINEPHRINE ADMINISTRATION BY AUTO-INJECTOR  
IN THE STREMS REGION**

**Epinephrine Auto-Injector (EAI) Provider**, and I, \_\_\_\_\_,

**Emergency Health Care Provider**, (physician or hospital Chief Executive Officer or designee),

agree to abide by the following terms **and** conditions set forth by Section 3000-C of Article 30 of the *Public Health Law of the State of New York* for the provision of Epinephrine Administration by Autoinjector (EAI) by the EAI Provider:

1. The EAI Provider and all trained EAI operator(s) shall operate under appropriate New York State regulations and DOH advisories.
2. The EAI Provider shall ensure that all persons designated to administer an EAI have successfully completed an EAI training course which has been approved by the New York State Department of Health or the New York State Emergency Medical Services Council or the Southern Tier Regional Emergency Medical Advisory Committee.
3. Prior to operation of an EAI, the EAI Provider shall notify the STREMS Council its existence.
4. The EAI Provider shall comply with Section 3000-C of Article 30 of the Public Health Law of the State of New York.
5. The EAI Provider and EAI Operators shall ensure that the appropriate Emergency Medical Dispatch Center is **immediately** called when a request for the EAI is received.
6. The EAI Provider and EAI Operators shall ensure that the Emergency Health Care Provider is notified within 24 hours of each use of an EAI.
7. The EAI Provider shall ensure that all EAIs are maintained according to manufacturer and/or government standards.
8. The responsibilities of the Emergency Health Care Provider shall include, but will not be

limited to the following:

- i. Monitoring the quality of patient care provided by the EAI Provider and all EAI Operators.
  - ii. Require EAI operator participation in the STREMS Region Recertification Program for EAI Providers.
9. The EAI Provider and the Emergency Health Care Provider agree to file a Collaborative Agreement every 2 (two) years from the date of the initial Collaborative Agreement. If the Emergency Health Care Provider changes, a new Collaborative Agreement shall be filed within 5 (five) business days. Additionally, if the Emergency Health Care Provider resigns, s/he shall immediately notify the STREMS Council in writing.
